2. DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- 2.1 Manage the Transforming Communities Project (KUZA JAMII), that will help participants start businesses to uplift their living standards and graduate out of poverty.
- 2.2 Provide mentoring to the agreed number of small business enterprises under the Transforming Communities Project (KUZA JAMII).
- 2.3 In a collaborative process with the community, relevant County and National Government agencies, Consortium members, target and identify eligible beneficiaries for the project, based on the consortium's beneficiary selection criteria.
- 2.4 Meet with established Business Groups (BGs) as required, help them make decisions about their business and provide mentorship and guidance as needed.
- 2.5 Conduct/deliver business and savings skills trainings including financial management to the businesses in the designated locations and surrounding manyattas.
- 2.6 Support the mentors to ensure participants succeed in production, trade, and value addition based on locally available resources.



- 2.7 Perform a minimum of agreed visits per week to the business groups and savings groups for which you are responsible.
- 2.8 Collect data and information for individuals, business group performance, participation of BG members in savings groups, savings group performance, participants living standards, participation in climate change adaptations, and other relevant information.
- 2.9 Upload quality data and information on groups performance using the GENCAD's Taroworks system (information management technology) as required.
- 2.10 Report on the businesses and savings groups' performances to the Field Officer.
- **2.11** Represent GENCAD in the designated location, including as a representative for the organization in local development committees.

3. QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE

- 3.1 At least a Diploma in community development, social work or another related discipline.
- 3.2 At least two (2) years' experience in similar work; with proven experience in data collection
- Possess excellent interpersonal skills; should be able to relate well to both the beneficiaries with whom we work, and the GENCAD's Field Officer.
- 3.4 Be self-driven, and able to work with minimal staff supervision.
- 3.5 Must be a native of the respective ward you are applying for with working knowledge of English, Swahili and the local language.
- 3.6 Have a valid motorcycle license and has experience on how to ride a motorcycle.
